We're back, baby! Happy fall programming season, everyone; we're starting off hot with some old and new favorites:

- **New Americas Cinema**: Brings together the cutting-edge of new art house and independent filmmaking from North, Central, and South America. This fall we've got a 4K restoration of a Scorsese classic (*Raging Bull*), the first-ever Guatemalan film to screen at the Cinema (*Cadejo Blanco*), a Canadian/Caribbean crossover (*Brother*), the art house hit of the summer (*Past Lives*), and a politically charged Brazilian thriller that's so new we can't tell you the name of it yet! Co-sponsored by our friends at the Ryder Film Series.
- Sirens & Spitfires: Liberated Ladies of Pre-Code Cinema: Celebrating the women of the Golden Age who burned their way through the screen. Includes films with Jean Harlow, Bette Davis, Barbara Stanwyck, and more!
- **Creative Collaborations: Ending Overdose Together**: A vital partnership with the Indiana Recovery Alliance emphasizing harm reduction with a series illuminating the realities of the overdose crisis and the stigma people who use drugs face within our communities.
- Women on Top: Training a focused eye on the past, present, and future legacies of women in global film production. This semester has a pitch-black comedic and suspenseful debut from Brazil (*Charcoal*), a meditation from a MacArthur genius on the (in)humanity of technology (*Users*), and two events celebrating novelist and screenwriter Ursula Parrott.

You know there is more: *Jaws* in 3D, a rare screening of the Disney classic *Fantasia*, the return of CatVideoFest, our Welcome Back Open House, National Theatre Live... we love a stacked schedule.

URSULA PARROTT IN HOLLYWOOD

IU Cinema is excited to welcome Marsha Gordon to campus this August for a deep dive into Ursula Parrott.

Once the most notorious ex-wife in America, Ursula Parrott (1899-1957) was a prolific and best-selling author, Hollywood screenwriter, and consistent headline-grabber during her colorful, unconventional life. The press covered her new books, Hollywood deals, marriages and divorces, and numerous run-ins with the law. She was Radcliffeeducated; had four optimistic walks down the aisle (and back); piloted for the Civilian Air Corps during World War II; co-founded a weekly rural Connecticut newspaper; and travelled the world, including an extended story-collecting trip to Russia in the 1930s. She also worked as a screen and story writer out of Astoria as well as during several stints in Hollywood; her words gave Norma Shearer her only Academy Award and launched Jimmy Stewart's career as a lead actor.

Prof. Gordon recently published *Becoming the Ex-Wife: The Unconventional Life and Forgotten Writings of Ursula Parrott* and will bring her expertise to the Cinema to discuss many of the films adapted from Parrott's writing. Her talk will be paired with a book signing and screening of Douglas Sirk's *There's Always Tomorrow*, starring Fred MacMurray and Barbara Stanwyck and adapted from a novel by Parrott.

Marsha Gordon (Film Studies at North Carolina State University) is a recent Fellow at the National Humanities Center and an NEH Public Scholar. She is the author of numerous books and articles, and co-director of several short documentaries.
