NATIONAL THEATRE LIVE: VANYA

One of the more unique offerings we do every year, National Theatre Live is the National Theatre's groundbreaking project to broadcast the best of British theater straight from the London stage to cinemas around the world. This December, we're thrilled to bring you Vanya, the incredible reimagining of Anton Chekhov's Uncle Vanya by Simon Stephens (The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time) and starring Andrew Scott doing not just one but several tour de force performances.

Filmed live during the play's sold-out run in London's West End, hopes, dreams, and regrets are thrust into sharp focus in this one-man adaptation which explores the complexities of human emotions. Ivan (Uncle Vanya) has spent his life managing the estate and business affairs of his family with little regard for his efforts. Scott plays the titular character; retired professor Alexander and his daughter Sonia; Alexander's second wife Helena; Vanya's widowed mother Maureen; his romantic rival, the country doctor Michael: and more.

Presented with open captions, Vanya will amaze you with its radical new vision of a theatrical mainstay and its showcase of the phenomenal talents of Andrew Scott, whose work includes Sherlock, Black Mirror, Fleabag, All of Us Strangers, Ripley, and the upcoming Knives Out 3. Loved by audiences and critics so much that it will be transferring to Off Broadway in the spring of 2025, this is your chance for a front-row seat right here in Bloomington before the show hits the New York stage.
